Is January too late for a Christmas gift?

A running joke in my family is that we are busier than we should be and, consequently, often late with everything. An I.O.U. under the Christmas tree is an annual occurrence for at least one member of the family. My mother's favorite joke about this was, "Well, even Jesus didn't get his Christmas gifts on Christmas." She was referring to the celebration of the Epiphany, when the wise men, or the magi, finally made it to the manger to honor the newborn King of kings, our Lord and Savior. They brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Since we celebrate the Epiphany on January 6th, they were 12 days late.

Last year, a few days after the epiphany, I received a generous and wonderful gift. All of you pitched in and invited me to serve my internship with you. When I arrived, I was greeted with immense hospitality and a big welcome sign on the front of the church. 
We may add a special Sunrise Service Easter morning. This will be determined sooner to the date and depending on weather.



Christians in Action Ministry- Submitted by Pastor Kristi Weber

Christians in Action Ministry has been serving ELCA congregations in South Central North Dakota since September 2022. This model for rural ministry has continued to gain interest from congregations around the country.

On Tuesday, December 17 nearly 20 leaders from the eight congregations of Christians in Action Ministry gathered at Emmanuel Lutheran in Gackle to meet with representatives of the ELCA Churchwide offices and Eastern North Dakota Synod Staff to talk about our experiences and to share what we have learned during these years of intentionally working together.

Rev. Phil Hirsch serves as the Executive Director of Christian Community and Leadership at the ELCA. He was in our synod to learn and experience rural ministry and some of the creative work around new models for ministry. Bishop Tessa Moon Leiseth of the Eastern North Dakota Synod and Deacon Erin Power (Director of Evangelical Mission for the Eastern North Dakota Synod) wanted him to hear of the challenges, realities, and the creative response to cultivate sustainable gospel witnesses in our area.

The robust conversation of the afternoon gave him much to consider as he interacts with Directors of Evangelical Mission in other synods throughout the church.

Congregation members from rural congregations talked about how our work together helps us feel like we are not alone in ministry. Members from Jamestown congregations talked about how our work together strengthens all our congregations. Christ the King in Ellendale appreciates the variety of voices they hear from different preachers each Sunday.

One goal our congregations set as Christians in Action Ministry in 2022 was to have a minister living in the parsonages in Kulm, Gackle, and Medina. Within 16 months, that goal was met and each of these communities has had a resident minister throughout 2024. The Bishop noted that many congregations along the I-29 corridor now have pastors who live in Fargo or Grand Forks and who commute to the more rural communities. The model of residential ministers is highly valued within Christians in Action Ministry.

Ministers spoke of the importance of Synod Authorized Ministers (SAM) and lay preachers and worship leaders as part of a healthy team approach to ministry. Colleagues are only a phone call or regularly scheduled Zoom meeting away.

Following lunch and conversation, the group shared time for worship together. Then Rev. Hirsch, Bishop Moon Leiseth, and Deacon Power drove to Cogswell to meet with leaders of the Wahpeton Conference who are being equipped for pastoral care, worship, preaching, and evangelism. This Wahpeton area cohort is made possible through a churchwide grant from the unit for Christian Community and Leadership of the ELCA funded through congregational mission support. In our own communities, the

internship for Vicar Andrew Stephens was supported in part by a \$15,000 grant from the Eastern North Dakota Synod Vital Leaders Endowment Fund.

Our afternoon together was a gift of relational support to one another. It shares a model to inspire the whole church.

Duties of the Ushers

(reviewed on 3/2022)

- 1. Arrive at church 30 minutes prior to service.
- 2. Turn Sanctuary lights on and off before and after service.
- 3. Raise and lower shades on windows before and after service.
- 4. Put up hymn numbers (numbers are in room to left of altar in cupboard).
- 5. Turn on the Cross at altar (switch is labeled in room to the right of altar).
- 6. Turn lamps on for the Lectern and Pulpit. Turn off after service.
- 7. Fill ceramic pitcher with water and place on baptismal font along with silver bowl that goes in the baptismal font (pitcher and bowl are located in room to the left of altar on the counter by sink).
- 8. Hand out bulletins, newsletters, etc.
- 9. Ring church bell at least 3 times just before beginning of the service.
- 10. Count the number of people attending the service (easily done from the balcony sometime after service has begun) (number in attendance is to be written in the book which is in the fellowship hall).
- 11. Receive offering plates, gathering offering, and bring offering forward when pastor signals.
- 12. Usher people forward for Holy Communion (one usher stands towards the front to allow worshipers to advance to front).
- 13. Usher people out when church service has concluded.
